The FCC Sustains \$22,000 Fine for Egregious On Air Behavior. Michael Guensey KZ8O was fined in 2014 for intentionally interfering with other Amateur Radio communications and for failing to identify. The FCC said he is given 30 days to pay the fine or arrange an installment plan. The FCC also fined another Georgia ham David J. Tolassi W4BHV who was sited last August for failure to properly identify under Part 97 ID rules.

ARRL Filed More "Grow Lights" Ballast Complaints with the FCC. The issue of these complaints were commercial grow light ballast purchase from Home Depot that cause RF interference to HF communications.


International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend

This premier annual fun event began in 1995 when the Ayr Radio Group had the Scottish Northern Lighthouse Weekend. The concept proved so popular that it was renamed and opened up to the world.

Always held on the third weekend of August, it has steadily grown to now attract more than 500 lighthouses and lightship from about 50 countries. The main reason for its popularity is that the weekend is a fun event, held under simple guidelines, and in the spirit of international goodwill. With four weeks to go 350 registrations have been received. In 2014 there were 544, making it an average 20 a year increase over the last eight years.

In the lead so far is Germany on 64, followed by Australia 58, USA 45 and England 33. Among the newest are Belgium ON4OS at Lange Nelle, Cuba CO9FAA Los Colorados, Malaysia 9M4LHX St Paul's Church, Spain EG1LWC Corrubedo and Switzerland HB9FVR at Romanshorn.

HAMCON 2015


The 2015 ARRL Southwestern Division Convention, is September 11-13, 2015 at the Torrance Marriott Redondo Beach Hotel (same location as the 2007 and 2011 conventions.)

Please visit: www.hamconinc.org for complete information. You will find a full Vendor/Exhibitor Hall (65 booths), along with many interesting Tech Talk speakers. Every paid attendee also receives four free door prize tickets--no additional tickets will be sold or offered--and everyone has an equal chance. The grand registration door prize is a Kenwood TS-590SG HF transceiver. Amateur Radio Vanity Call Sign Fee to Disappear in September

The Amateur Radio vanity call sign regulatory fee is set to disappear in the next few weeks. According to the best-available information from FCC sources, the first day that applicants will be able to file a vanity application without having to pay a fee is Thursday, September 3. In deciding earlier this year to drop the regulatory fee components for Amateur Radio vanity call signs and General Mobile Radio Service (GMRS) applications, the FCC said it was doing so to save money and personnel resources. The Commission asserted that it costs more of both to process the regulatory fees and issue refunds than the amount of the regulatory fee payment.

"Our costs have increased over time, and now that the costs exceed the amount of the regulatory fee, the increased relative administrative cost supports eliminating this regulatory fee category," the FCC said in its Report and Order, which appeared on July 21 in The Federal Register. "Once [it's] eliminated, these licensees will no longer be financially burdened with such payments, and the Commission will no longer incur these administrative costs that exceed the fee payments."

The FCC raised the Amateur Service vanity call sign regulatory fee from \$16.10 to its current \$21.40 for the 10-year license term in 2014. The \$5.30 increase was the largest such fee hike in many years. In a typical fiscal year, the FCC collected on the order of \$250,000 in vanity call sign regulatory fees.

The FCC said the revenue it would otherwise collect from such regulatory fees "will be proportionally assessed on other wireless fee categories." Congress has mandated that the FCC collect nearly \$340 million in regulatory fees from all services in fiscal year 2015.

AREDN Announces Release of Second Beta, v3.15.1.0b2

On July 3rd the AREDN Project posted a second beta release of its upcoming v3.15.1.0 software. It can be found through the Experimental Builds link on the Software Downloads page. While you are encouraged to download it and report any issues, direct support for this release is currently only provided to AREDN Beta Testers. Due to the potentially unstable nature of beta software, it should not be deployed in production networks.



If you are already on 3.15.1.0b01, then you can easily use the OTA (Over the Air) "keep settings" upgrade! Joe (AE6XE) did his first 5+mile remote-over-RF upgrade and saved an afternoon and a long uphill hike (This was on a Ubiquiti 3Ghz node). We've had some great feedback on the "part 97 only" channels where they have significantly improved link quality results

In addition, these are 'clean' image upgrades that minimize memory usage. Whenever 'patch' files are used on nodes, this is a memory additive process. In other words, a replaced file still has old file on the node in addition to the new the file. These BOTH consume precious system memory. The OTA upgrade, on the other hand, behaves as if you did a TFTP "clean" image load, but also pulls the config file settings across the upgrade! It's a VERY COOL timesaver.

For those of you with tunnels, you will need to go into the Admin interface and click on the "Install Tunnel" button. However, after a quick install and reboot, all tunnel settings are preserved and no re-entry is needed. By design, we are not including add-on 'packages' like vtun in the OTA.

Announcements: Frank said that a group of recently ordered badges had come in. Rick Slater, AG6AY, spoke

about the preliminary results for the Field Day operation. He said there were over 2,800 contacts made with the estimated point total approximately 8500. Final totals will be posted on the "N6R" page at qrz.com. Steve King, KE6WEZ, mentioned upcoming events; Camarillo Airshow, Simi Valley Half Marathon, and others. He said to check email and the ACS Calendar for event dates. Frank said he is looking for an August meeting program speaker. He said he will be working for the gas company on a pipeline safety project and that may lead to a talk he can give us at a

meeting.

Introductions: A round of introductions was held. Guests included: Norm Campbell, AB6ET, Ken Larson, KJ6RZ,

Donna Smith, KK6ROI, and Kyle McNicoll who was awaiting his callsign. (Secretary's note: Kyle's

call is KK6VHM)

<u>Program</u>: President Frank introduced our program speaker, Ken Larson, KJ6RZ, who gave a presentation

on the subject of "Maximum Usable Frequency". Ken became a ham in the late 1950's and through the 1960's, and returned to the hobby in about 1989. He began with some background on the subject of HF radio propagation by reflection of radio waves from the lonosphere "layer" regions between 30 and 600 miles above the Earth. It is solar radiation that creates the ionization layers. Ken explained that radio waves are refracted back toward Earth when the elevation angles of incidence are below a "critical angle" that varies inversely with the radio frequency. He showed the equations to calculate critical frequency and gave examples of a chart of elevation angle vs propagation distance. After the talk, Ken answered questions about the propagation coverage

shown on the Band Conditions Maps included in his slides. A copy of Ken's presentation is available on the cvarc.org website under "technical articles".

After this very interesting program, Frank presented Ken with a certificate of appreciation from the

Simi Settlers.

Break: A 20-minute break was taken at 8:34pm with refreshments provided by Jim, KJ6LXJ, and Linda

Parker, filling in for our regular refreshments chairman Bill Everett, KI6KSV.
