His presentation covered the new updated software at the Chatsworth Peak and South Mountain nodes. At the presentation, he showed view from a webcam at Chatsworth Peak via his home node to a portable node connected to his laptop at the Senior Center. In another update, he mentioned a node and software update at the Simi Valley EOC.

I receive a response from Dianne Feinstein U.S. Senator for California in regards to H.R. 1301 the Amateur Radio Parity Act. On January 13, 2017 U.S. Representative Adam Kinzinger (R-IL) reintroduce the H.R. 1301 the Amateur Radio Parity. Senator Feinstein believes that H.R. 1301 is a better bill than (S.1685) because of the important compromise between the radio associations and the home owners associations. She mentions the service that amateur radio volunteers provides to local, state, and federal government is invaluable and it is important to keep the airwaves free and available to continue their good work. If the bill gets to the Senate, she will keep our views in mind, should legislation comes before the U.S Senate.

Enforcement of Section 23123.5 of the California Vehicle Code

To: All Commands Reference: Action Required Subject: Enforcement of Section 23123.5 of the California Vehicle Code

Effective January 1, 2017, Section 23123.5 of the California Vehicle Code (CVC) was amended by Assembly Bill 1785, which substantially expanded the scope of Section 23123.5 CVC, from simply prohibiting the use of a wireless phone to text while driving, to prohibiting holding and operating a handheld wireless telephone or an electronic wireless communications device while driving.

However, a driver may still use a handheld wireless telephone or an electronic wireless communication device while driving when:

The handheld wireless communication device is mounted to a windshield (in compliance with Section 26708[b] CVC), dashboard, or center console in a manner which does not interfere with the drivers view of the road, and;

The drivers hand is used to activate or deactivate a feature with a single tap or swipe of the drivers finger.

Pursuant to Section 23123.5(f) CVC, the definition of an electronic wireless communications device includes, but is not limited to: a broadband personal communication device, a specialized mobile radio device, a handheld device or laptop computer with mobile data access, a pager, or a two-way messaging device.

Section 23123.5 CVC does not apply to manufacturer-installed systems which are embedded in the vehicle, nor does it apply to an emergency services professional using a wireless telephone while operating an authorized Emergency vehicle, in the course and scope of employment.

For the purposes of Section 23123.5(f) CVC, a radio installed and mounted in a vehicle with a wired hand microphone (e.g., business band or citizen band [CB] radio) is not considered a wireless communication device, nor is it considered a specialized mobile radio device, and therefore is not subject to enforcement under this section.

This information will be added to an upcoming revision to Highway Patrol Manual 100.68, Traffic Enforcement Policy Manual, Chapter 5, Other Enforcement Issues.



New Repeater in Test 145.16

Hello All,

Last week on Tuesday March 28, 2017 the team:

Rob Hanson W6RH Matt Lechliter W6KGB Bill Talanian W1UUQ Paul Strauss WD6EBY

made the 12.5 hour round trip to Santa Barbara, Santa Ynez Peak (~4,300ft) to instill the 145.16 /127.3 linked Repeater. The day was long, very windy and cold. Despite the harsh conditions the instillation of the linked repeater was a success.

This 145.16 (K6TZ) linked repeater system is a Co-op between Bill Talanian, W1UUQ (trustee of K6TZ) and Paul Strauss, WD6EBY. The addition of this interconnect repeater brings us one step closer to establishing the permanent Tri-County (ARRL-Santa Barbara Section, Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Louis Obispo Counties) communications network. This Tri-County network is intended to provide camaraderie with other Section Amateurs. Additionally this network will provide a means of communicating during times of disasters and Mutual Aid requests for Amateur resources and furthering our abilities to the agencies we serve.

Please Note:

Santa Ynez Peak is experiencing an intermittent high noise level, which at times makes it difficult to access the repeater even with a high power mobile or base station. An investigation is currently underway and the team is looking to resolve this noise issue shortly.

I want to thank Rob for braving the cold and high winds while performing the required tower work. Bill for providing the equipment for this instillation and the management for this site. Matt for his RF technical expertise in construction of the repeater interconnect - trouble shooting, and for the programming of the controller. This was truly a team effort.

As of this email Starting today, this new repeater will be interconnected to the WD6EBY linked repeaters through a link from Sulphur Mtn. If you are within the coverage of SYP give it a try and let me know of any issues or concerns.

Simi Settlers Amateur Radio Club General Membership Meeting, March 9, 2017

- <u>Call to Order</u>: President, Frank Valdez, KI6OQ, called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. Frank welcomed everyone to the meeting, held at the Simi Valley Senior Center. There was a recitation of The Pledge of Allegiance. 8 Officers and Board Members/Advisors were present. The total attendance was 27, with one visitor.
- Introductions: A brief round of introductions was made. Visitor Brian Webb, KD6NRP, was welcomed.
- Announcements: Frank read a card from Linda Smith thanking the Simi Settlers Club for the flowers sent to the memorial service for Spencer Smith, N6IWY. Frank also mentioned that he attended the service for Dale Manquen, KO6VO. The Board of Directors has been considering ways to reduce expenses for the Club. Frank mentioned that one idea was to reduce the number of annual picnics from two to one. The cost of reserving the barbecue and picnic table area is \$70 to \$75 for a four-hour reservation. Rick Galbraith, W6DQE, said he would be willing to sponsor the cost for the park picnic reservation. There was indication that other members would also be willing to contribute toward the picnic expense. The Board will consider this idea to see if we can continue to hold both our
- Frank introduced Orv Beach, W6BI, gave a presentation titled: "Digital MESH Networking in Program: Southern California – An Update". Orv began with an overview of the equipment and frequencies now in common use. The 2.4GHz band as been most widely used but testing is going on with 5.8GHz being used to build a backbone trunk system. There is a ham band in the 3GHz range that will be tried for Mesh networking. Orv spoke about some of the applications such as: video, text chat and messaging, document management and emergency communication. On a map of our region Orv showed where there are active stations here and in the Santa Barbara area. He also showed how links are being set up between these areas of activity. Orv described projects that are planned for this year. He hopes to expand the number of users in all areas and improve and expand the linkage between Ventura and Santa Barbara counties. They are working to get the Simi Valley Hospital Mesh station completed and to implement more Emergency Communications links. Orv said the Laguna Peak site will have to be replaced and the site for Ojai Valley needs to be upgraded. Orv gave a live demo of Mesh communication from a transceiver unit at the meeting room's outside door and through Steve King KE6WEZ's truck in the parking lot and then to Orv's home station and his outdoor camera. With mesh networking software on his laptop computer Orv showed a link with images from another camera located at KM6FQ's home. After the end of Orv's talk and questions, Frank thanked Orv for keeping us informed about the latest developments. Frank mentioned that the Gas Company is using a mesh system at the storage facility near Porter Ranch, where over 100 gas wells are being monitored.
- Break: At 8:20pm, a 20-minute break was taken with refreshments provided by Bill Everett, KI6KSV.
- <u>Member Drawing</u>: The winning name in the progressive Membership drawing was Allen Pettebone, KA6WGO, who was not present to win the \$20 prize. The prize amount will be increased to \$30 for our next regular meeting on April 13, 2017. Members must be present to win, and the prize grows by \$10 each month it is unclaimed.
- <u>Prize Raffle</u>: After the prize raffle drawing, the Grand Prize winner of a Baofeng UV-B6 Dual Band HT was Jim Veronica, WA6NXK. Jim will be our program speaker at the April meeting on the subject of his ultra-light aircraft flying.
- Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 8:48pm.
