

Two-meter Winlink at my QTH - Orv W6BI

If some (height) is good, more is better, right? My antenna for VARA FM is up about 25 feet on the second floor chimney. In the hopes of improving the coverage on 145.03, Eric KE6MLF and Eric KB6DYJ added two crossarms and two short masts to the top of my tower. One mast is a spare, the other had a Diamond X50NA VHF/UHF antenna installed. Once they got the crossarms and antenna and jumper cable installed, they connected a length of 3/8" heliax cable and fastened it two one leg of the tower.

It was a grueling task; they both were up at the top of the tower for over an hour. I anticipate improved coverage from the antenna when it's at 55 feet instead of 25 feet. The antenna hasn't been connected to the radio yet but it looks really good!! :-D

ARRL June VHF Contest - Ron K6RIN

ARRL's annual June VHF Contest will be the second weekend of June this year. The contest officially runs from June 12, 1800 UTC, through June 14, 0259 UTC. The Contest objective is for amateurs in the US and Canada to work as many amateur stations in as many different grid squares as possible using authorized frequencies above 50 MHz. All legal modes are permitted, including CW, SSB/Phone, FM, MSK144, FT8, PSK31, FSK441, and JT65.

Amateur radio operators have taken different approaches to participating in the VHF contests. These include setting up a mobile or portable station in an elevated area such as a mountain top or high rise building in order to make as many contacts as possible, or by operating in a mobile capacity in order to operate in as many grid squares as possible.

National Peace Officers Memorial Special Event Station - Ron K6RIN

In October 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation from Congress designating May 15th as "National Peace Officers Memorial Day," and the week leading up to May 15 as "National Police Week." On this special day we remember those Peace Officers who have lost their lives while protecting their communities.

On May 15, 2021, members of the Simi Settlers Amateur Radio Club and the SOTA LEO's Amateur radio club combined forces to operate a "Special Event Station" (Call sign WA6LE) in the front public parking lot of the Simi Valley Police Department, in an effort to commemorate this important day. The station was set up using portable radio equipment powered by batteries and a solar panel.

A Special Event Station's purpose is to call special attention to an event or occasion, in order to raise awareness. This is done by making radio contacts with other Amateur "Ham" radio operators around the country and even around the world, and providing a brief explanation about the special event being commemorated. This event was very successful in that the operation netted 33 contacts with Hams throughout the United States. Many were not aware of National Peace Officer's Memorial Day and expressed gratitude for the sacrifices that have been made by officers and their families.

The WA6LE station was staffed by: Ron Nelson (K6RIN), Brian Hernandez (KM6MIN), and Frank Valdez (KI6OQ).

Special Thanks to the Simi Valley Police Department for allowing us to use their parking lot for our station. They have invited us to come back and operate next year.
