Hello all,

Our recent uncertainty about returning to in-person meetings at the Simi Valley Senior Center got me to look into my Secretary's archives to see how we got started meeting there. The following summarizes what I found:

In 2006 we were meeting at the Seventh Day Adventist Church, 1636 Sinaloa Rd., SImi Valley. The Club had a benefactor behind the scenes who was paying the Church for our use of a meeting room. That support was going to end so an effort was started to find a new location for our meetings. There was a front page announcement in the April and May 2006 "Short Circuit" newsletters with the headline "Crisis Developing - We May Need a New Meeting Place!!".

In the July 2006 Newsletter, the headline was: "NEW MEETING PLACE!!!!!" announcing that our July 13th meeting would be held at the Simi Valley Senior Center. The minutes of the June 8 General Meeting included an announcement by Vice President Spencer Smith, N6IWY, that a new location had been arranged to begin in July. Spencer thanked our Treasurer, Ed Richards, K6UUZ, for his help making arrangements with the Simi Valley Senior Center. Sadly, Spencer and Ed have been Silent Keys for some time now.

In later years our Treasurer Norbert Rehaut, W9YPM, (Silent Key) helped with our arrangements with the Senior Center.

As an additional note, in that July 2006 newsletter, our then President and acting Newsletter Editor, Dale Manquen, KO6VO, included a note giving our thanks to the Seventh Day Adventist Church for their support over the many years we had met there. He also recognized the benefactor Mr. William Hebard, N6MBV, who made our tenure at the church possible.

We now need our Club to make a coordinated contact with the Senior Center about our being able to hold meetings there once again. I thank Richard Johnson, N6HJD, for sending me and our PIO Linda Parker, the name of the Manager of the Senior Center, Angel Sierra,

- <u>Secretary:</u> Minutes from the June General Meeting were published in the July Newsletter. They were approved.
- <u>Treasurer:</u> Glenn Daly, WA6GNB, was not present, therefore there was no Treasurer's Report.
- Election:President Brian Hernadez, KM6MIN, opened the nominations for the F/Y
2021/22 Officer/Board Member elections. There was a Quorum of at least 1/3

The N6R event has claimed at score of 3,458 points. Member Drawing: President Brian Hernandez, KM6MIN, conducted the progressive membership drawing of \$30 and reported that Bill Everett KI6KSV had been drawn. Bill was not present so the prize will increase to \$40 for the General Membership meeting in August.
