Alabama Hills SOTA Activation

On August 31st, I set out on another "Summits on the Air" (SOTA) ham radio expedition to the Alabama Hills near Lone Pine, CA. This was actually "Plan B" as my "Plan A" of camping and hiking in the White Mountains in the Ancient Bristlecone Pine Forest was curtailed due to the recent closure of most the National Forests in California. The Alabama Hills, made famous due to their use by many movie production companies going back decades, made for an enjoyable experience. The bonus is they are just outside the Inyo National Forest and therefore fare game.

Since I only planned to camp over two nights, my first night was spent preparing for two summits the next day. The second night was spent recovering from two grueling hikes.

On the morning of September 1, I hiked a hill known as "Hill 5,200," W6/SS-449. Interestingly, it was a steep 3.4 mile hike, ending up at 5,235' above sea level. I lugged along my Yaesu FT-891 and the tried-and-true vertical antenna. I ended up with 31 contacts on 17, 20, and 40 meter SSB. Highlights included contacts with George KL7ILA in Wasilla, Alaska, and Chris F4WBN in Southern France.

After completing that hike, I started out on the second summit of the day, Alabama Hill, W6/SS-636, at 5'433' above sea level. This was a grueling 2.4 mile hike across open desert (no trail) and a class 3 scramble over large boulders for the last ½ mile in 95 degree heat. I should have taken more water. Highlights included another contact with Chris F4WBN, a contact with Andrea IK5BOH, operating a mobile station in Milano, Italy, and a contact with Paul KG7QCY, a pilot onboard a

commercial 747 flying over the Pacific Ocean. In all, I had 34 contacts on 20 and 40 meters SSB over a 34-minute timespan. Very exciting!

Of course, you can't beat the views of the Owens Valley and the Eastern Sierras from the Alabama Hills. Another benefit, the camping is free in this BLM dispersed camping area. Of course there was breakfast the next morning at my favorite place, the "Alabama Hills Café" in Lone Pine, specializing in Cinnamon Roll French Toast. Yum!

AREDN MESH Portable Go Box

I am building amy second portable mesh go box. The box contains a 20 Ahr LiFePo battery, a soar charge controller, a Raspberry Pi, a Mikrotik HapAC Router Board, dc-dc converters to power the mesh radios and ip camera, and misc. connectors, wiring, etc.... This article is just a preliminary look at the nearly completed box. A followup article will provide details about the main equipment choices, application software, construction details, power management and so forth.









This box will be deployed with a solar panel and 5GHz dish at the Runkle Cyn Park aid station for the Share The Road Ride on 10/02/2021 to supply live video/still feeds for display at the STRR Net-Control station in Lemon Park.

Apply for a grant from the ARRL or ARDC By Dan Romanchik, KB6NU

In our division director's September missive to the membership yesterday was this nugget:

ARRL IS CURRENTLY OFFERING GRANTS to fund amateur radio projects. This program, sponsored by the ARRL Foundation, is specifically for organizations and aimed primarily for education, licensing and support of ham activities. A special focus is on youth-related plans. We are now entering the last phase of this year's grant cycle, so the opportunity exists for your club or organization to submit a grant request. You can find the full details on the grant page of the ARRL web pages, check: http://www.arrl.org/amateur-radio-grants.

The ARRL accepts grant requests three times a year:

February 1 – February 28 June 1 – June 30 October 1 – October 31

All proposals will be reviewed by the Grant Committee at the close of each cycle. Once the Committee agrees on the proposals to fund, they will be sent to the full Foundation Board for a formal vote. Awardees will be notified approximately one month after the closing of each cycle.

Eligibility and Guidelines

- Grant requests for emergency communications equipment, facilities, or projects will not be considered.
- Grant requests for ongoing operations or expenses will not be considered.
- Only programs and initiatives conducted within the United States are eligible for consideration.
- Proposals for projects with a high likelihood of sustainability or expansion are encouraged and preferred.
- Proposals for projects with demonstrated support of the local amateur radio community or clubs are encouraged and preferred.
- Grants are awarded only to organizations, not individuals.
- Awarded grants generally do not exceed \$3,000.
- The ARRL Foundation may elect to fund a qualified proposal in its entirety or partially at its sole discretion.
- It is rare for the ARRL Foundation to award an extension to a previously issued grant.
- The ARRL Foundation does not wish to be the sole funder of a proposal and gives preference to groups that provide evidence of other successful fundraising conducted prior to proposal submission.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm by President, Brian Hernandez, KM6MIN. Brian welcomed everyone to the meeting, held over the internet using Zoom. 7 Officers and Board Members/Advisors were present. The total attendance was approx. 12.

President: Brian mentioned that Jim Hutchinson, KI6MZ, was hurt in a fall at home in August. Jim is now recuperating at a care facility, and will return home when his balance returns to normal. To make sure Jim will be able to move around easily with a walker, once he gets home, Bill Woods, AB6BW, and assistants (Orv?) have moved some things at Jim's house.

Secretary: Secretary John Percival, Wi6o, thanked Ron Nelson, K6RIN, for recording minutes at the July and August meetings while John was absent. Minutes from the August General Meeting have been published in the Sept newsletter. It was MSP to approve the Secretary's report.

Treasurer: President Brian reported for Treasurer Glenn Daly, WA6GNB, who was not present. The current account balance is \$2,241.81, along with \$23 of petty cash. It was mentioned that the membership drawing had not been won since April, so the prize is \$50 for this month. It was MSP to accept the Treasurer's report.

Membership: Membership chairman Jim Parker, KJ6LXJ, reported on membership renewals. There have been 3 renewals received, or "in the mail". The report was approved by a motion MSP.

Publicity: PIO, Linda Parker, reports that we expect to hold our next general meeting in-person at the Simi Valley Senior Center, on Thursday, October 14, at 7PM. The Senior Center is requiring that all individuals attending will need to submit a "registration" form online using "DocuSign" or by printed copy. The mask policy has not been stated yet, so we should assume they will be required. Another restriction for this meeting is that we cannot make food available in the meeting, but bottled water is OK. Linda reminded us that we will continue to hold the Board Meetings using Zoom. It was MSP to approve the PIO's report.

Newsletter: Editor Eric Oberg, KE6MLF, said the September newsletter has been posted. He welcomes articles and pictures for use in the newsletters.

Planning: There was no guest speaker for this meeting, so President Brian spoke about future planning and invited comments from members. Brian said that Steve Noll, WA6EJO, will give a presentation about the rebuilding of his home that was lost in the 2017 Fire. Brian said he has interest in the "Dream Beam" antenna. Eric Oberg said he is still working on build projects for the Club. Orv Beach said that Steve King, KE6WEZ, will be moving to Idaho and Bill Woods, AB6BW, has indicated that he will take over for Steve as E.C. for Simi Valley. Also, the Share the Road Ride event will be in October, and volunteer radio operators are needed. Joe Partlow said he can give a meeting program presentation about 3-D Printing. Ron Nelson mentioned that John Kitchens could give us an update on the ARRL. Ron also said he is willing to give another presentation about his Summits on The Air (SOTA) activities. Linda Parker asked about Kevin Deadwylier, KD6UTC, who had indicated some interest in the Vice President position. Brian said he will contact Kevin to see if he is still interested in being V.P. Bill Everett, KI6KSV, said he is recovering from a broken knee.

Member Drawing: Brian made the drawing for the progressive Membership drawing and reported the winning name was Tuija Heinonen, KJ6WMR. Tuija was not logged into this Zoom meeting, so she did not win the \$50 prize for this month. The prize amount will therefore increase to \$60 for our October 14th meeting. When the Club resumes in-person meetings, members must be present at the meeting to win. The prize amount grows by \$10 each month it is unclaimed. Announcements: Ron Nelson mentioned that the weekend of June 12-13 will have the ARRL VHF Contest. He said he plans to operate portable during the contest.


Adjournment: The Zoom meeting was adjourned at 7:52 pm.
