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Member Updates

Bad Mast

I got this set of nesting aluminum tubes from a clean up job. Hose clamps squeeze the slotted end, so the tubes kind of have to be a close fit. At least two sections are missing, and there are additional two sections that can go on the top. \$20-30 each section. So if I want to use this, I have to pay money to complete the set, AND make some kind of a stand or mount.



Turns out these tubes were left outside, nested together. It was a herculean task to separate them. Removing corrosion on the outside was not too hard, but the inside bore was much more painful. Filing off burrs, cleaning up ends, and trying to sand all the crud was turning into a lot of work. I think there may be one or two sections with a small dent, preventing the next section from fully sliding inside.

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Maybe I can use them if I keep them separate, not nested. I will probably have to keep some kind of protective lubricant or coating on them. End result? **Do not buy** nesting aluminum mast sections. They **will** get corroded, dented, not slide together, and leave a lot of black aluminum oxide on your hands every time you work with them.

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So what to do if you acquire a good antenna, but it is only a tiny bit crusty and needs putting together and testing?

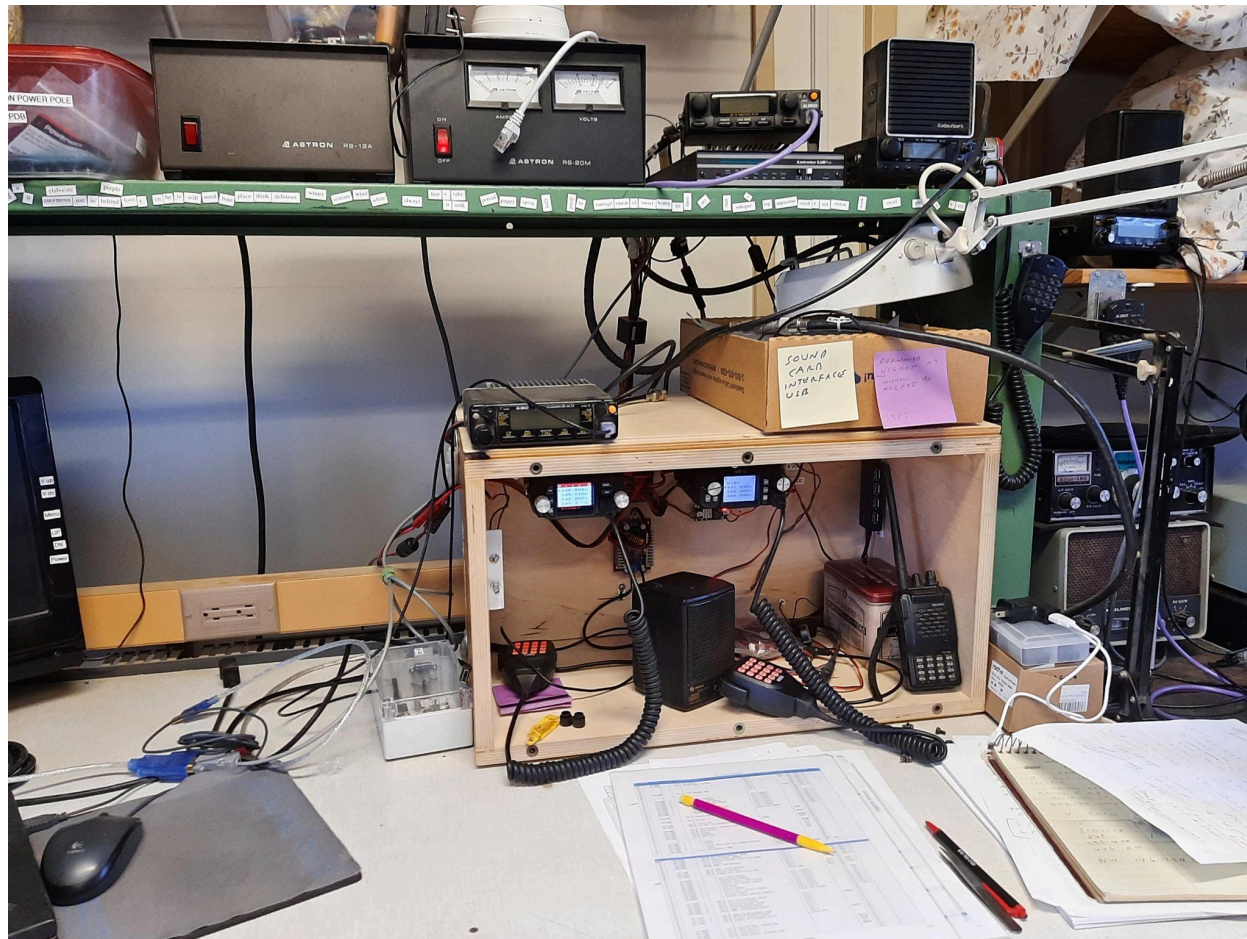
How about you give it to Kerwyn N6YHX for the task? Here is a Hustler 4 band vertical that Kerwyn is going to re-assemble and play with for a while.



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Use your Go Box at Home?

So, I was in kind of a loop using my regular VHF / UHF radios, and then working on my portable set. Too much moving around and re-connecting stuff. How about I just keep the boxed set on the bench, and use that for the Tuesday night check ins? Using it every week gives lots of ideas for improvement.



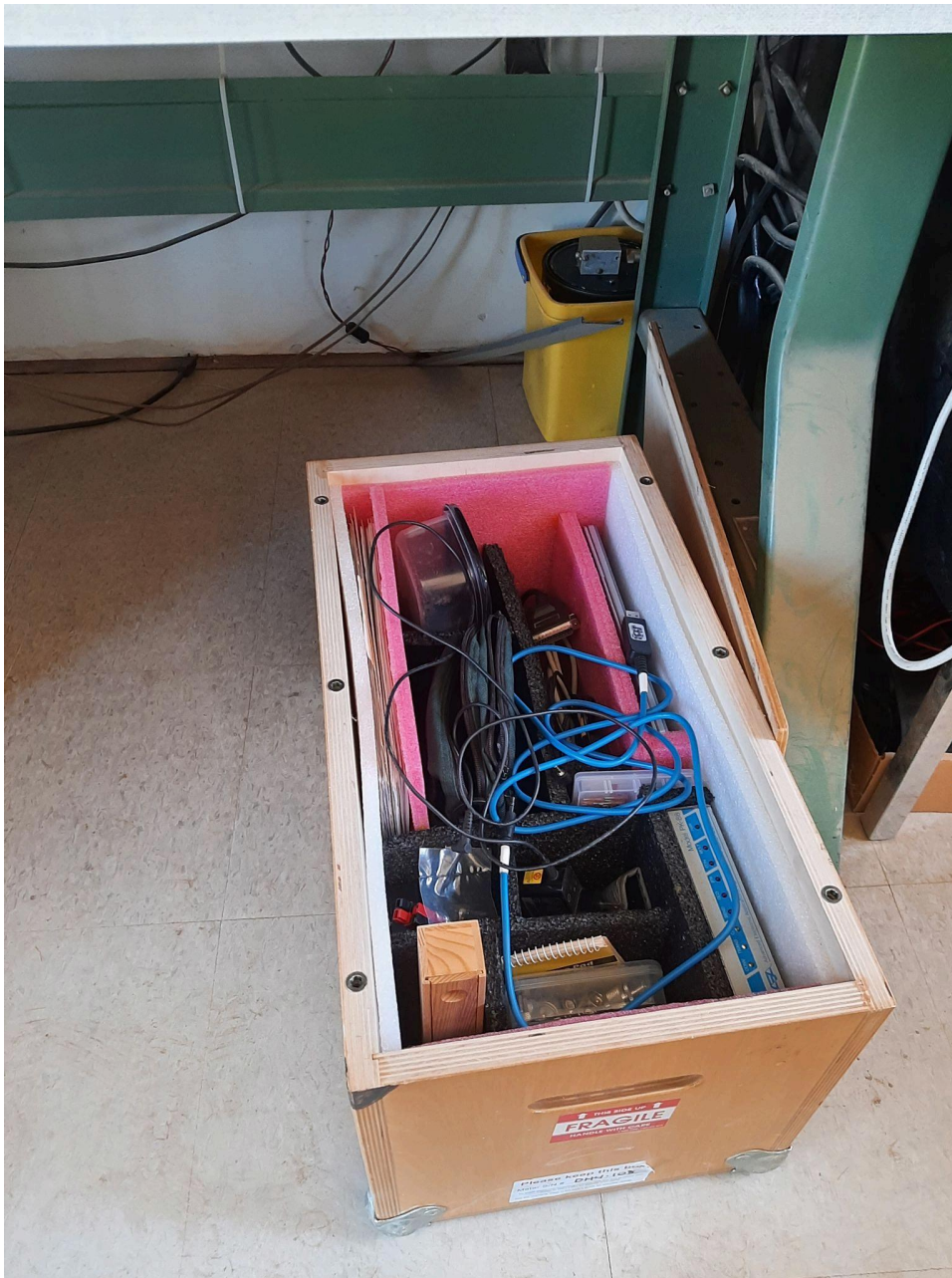
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Right under the bench is the “second box” holding papers, cables, fuses, and other bits. Makes for a good foot rest when the lid is on.



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Frequency lists, radio manuals, jumper cables... All the stuff that I might have to drag out anyway. Every time I think of something to add for portable operations, it goes in this box.



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Thumb Screws for Everything

I keep taking the Btech radios in and out of the portable box. A pain, cause I have to find a stubby screwdriver that fits between the radios and the side of the box.

Here is the solution, instant thumb screw. These little plastic knobs press (hard) on a cap head screw and give you a good grip with no tools. They come in lots of sizes.

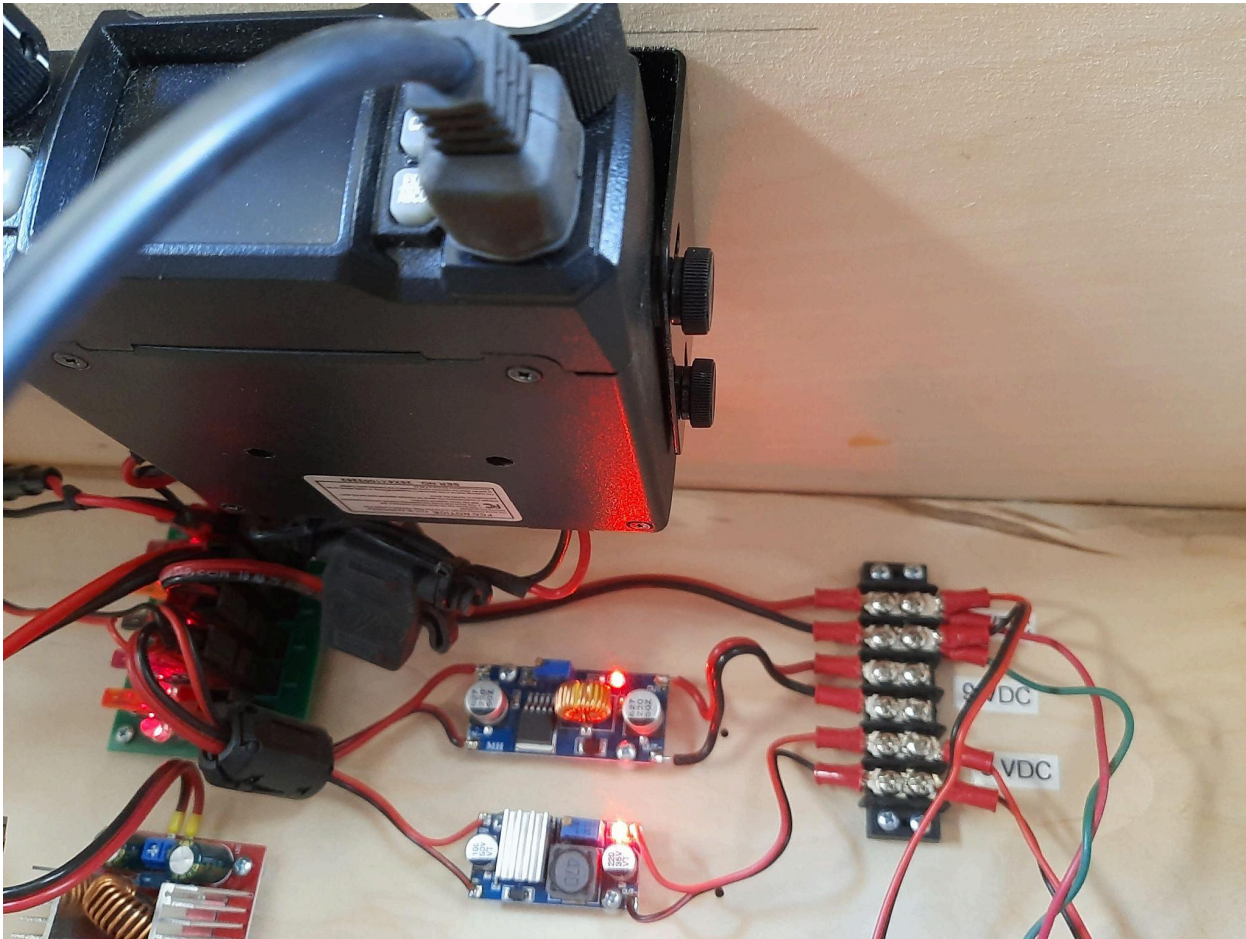


Old phillips head screws, and new thumb screws.

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Btech radio knobs

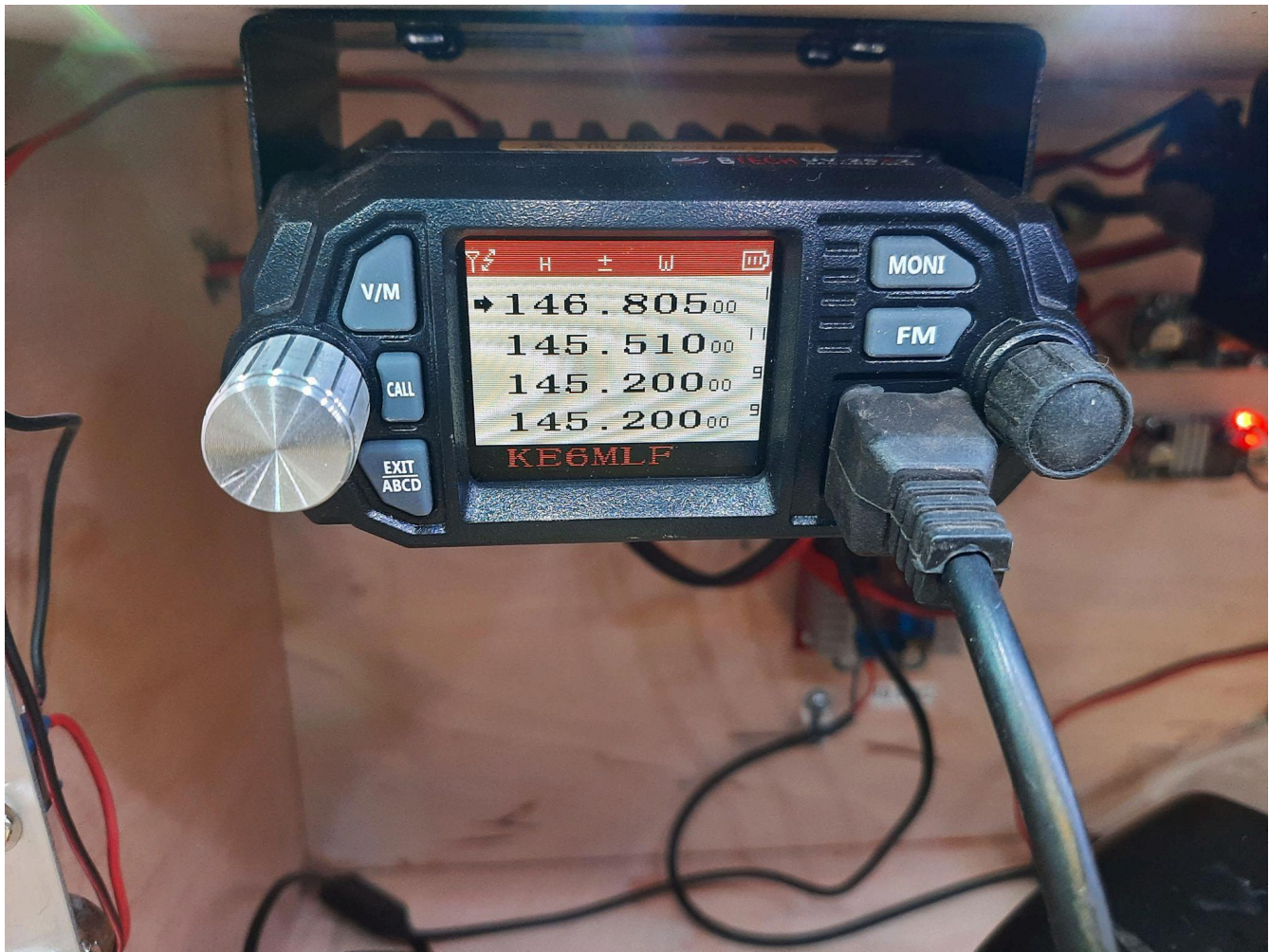
The radio Glenn WA6GNB gave me has these knobs on it. They work well.



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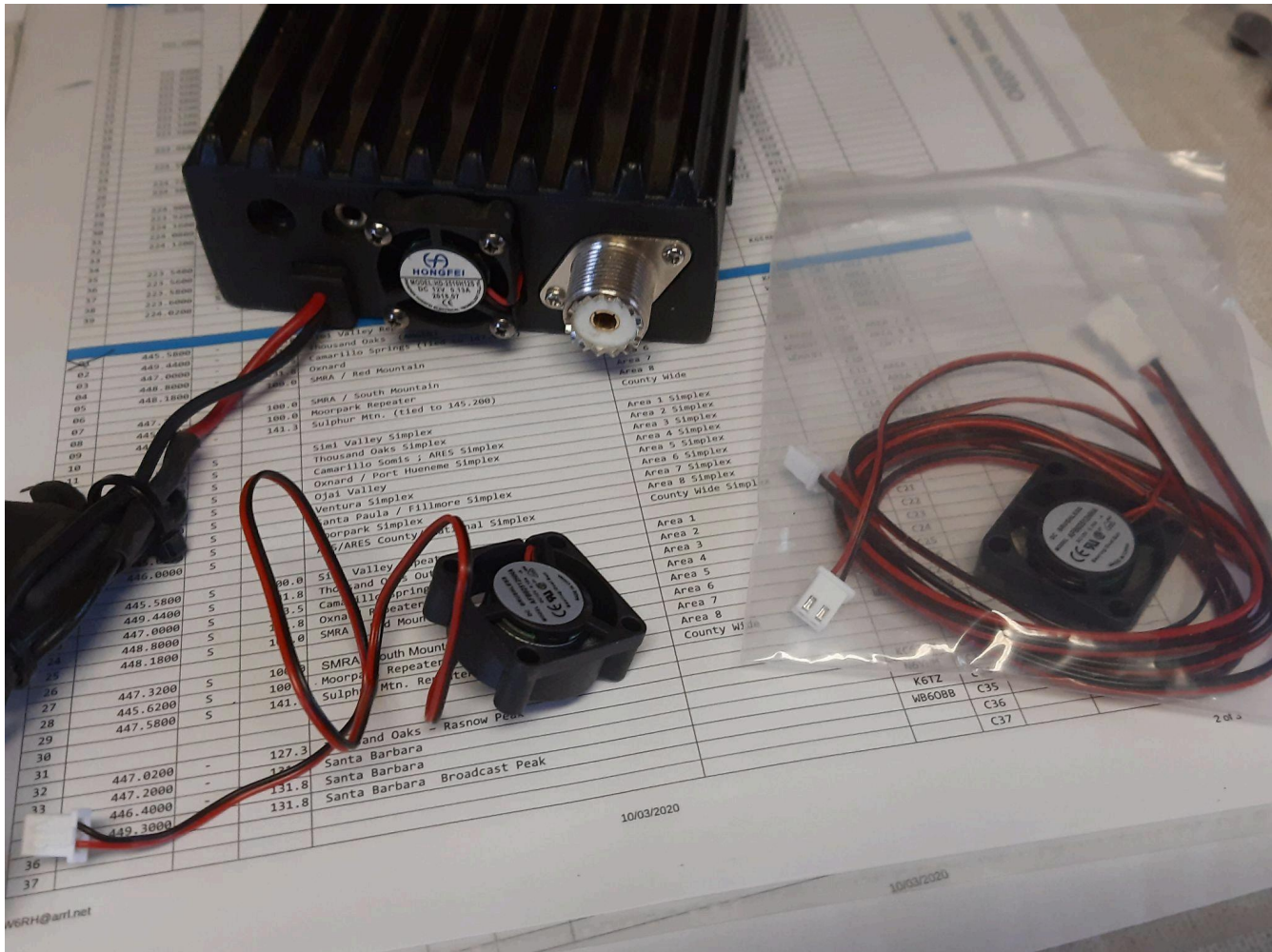
The newer Btech radio I bought has the tiny rubber knob as shown in the right hand dial, below. Too small, AND it keeps popping off. It is made of squishy rubber and not glued onto the potentiometer shaft. Sure as heck, if I put this radio on my marathon chasing bicycle, I will drop and lose the knob somewhere along the course.

The solution is as Glenn did, buy a replacement knob and secure it with a setscrew. The shiny silver knob on the left is a good fit, just got to rummage up another one.



Fans should be felt and not heard

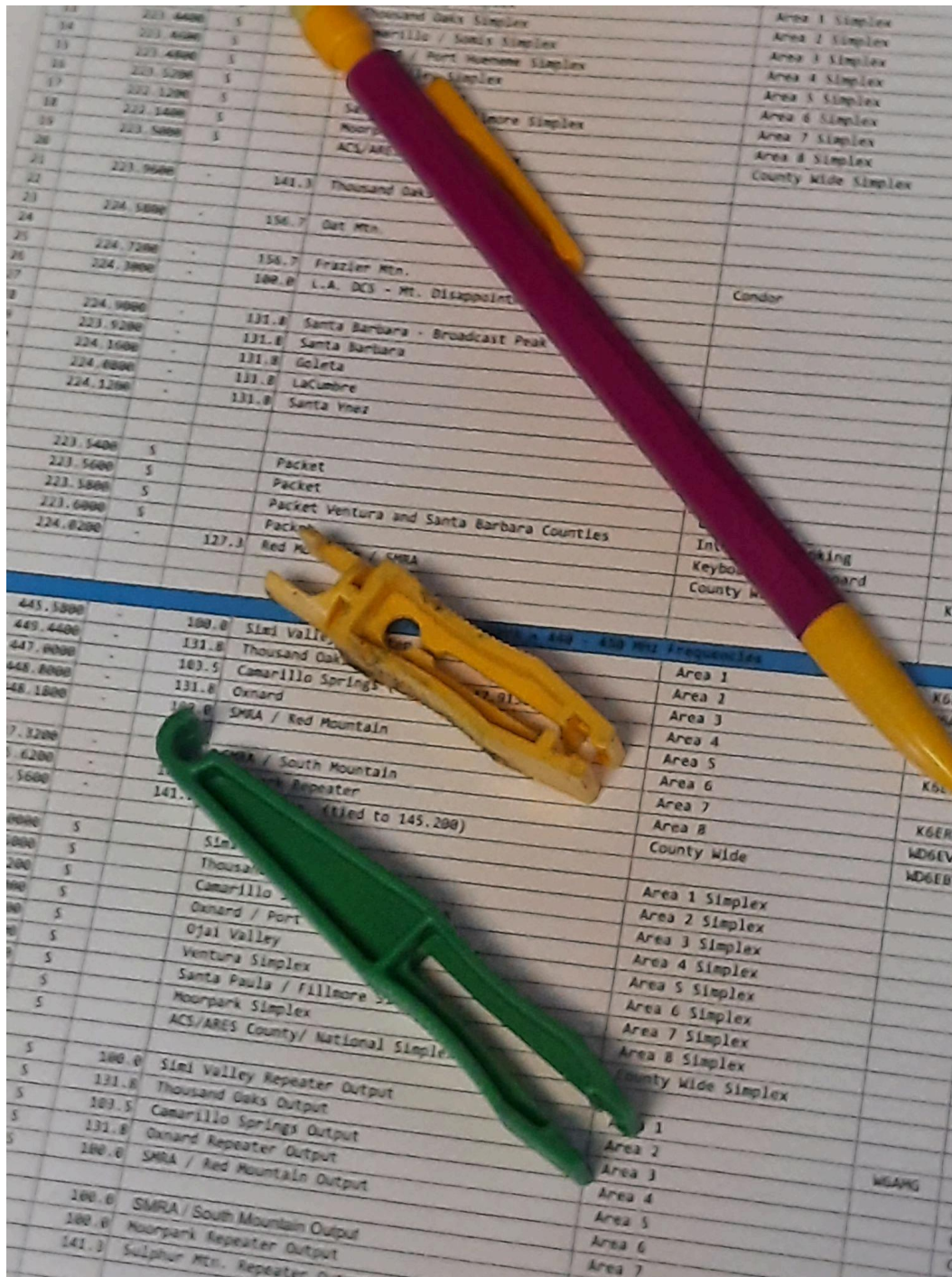
The tiny fan on the back of the older Btech radio squeals when it spins up. No problem, Amazon has these ball bearing replacements that cost \$10 for 2. Now I just gotta get brave and crack open the radio case to do the fan surgery. Would that be called a “fanendectomy” ?



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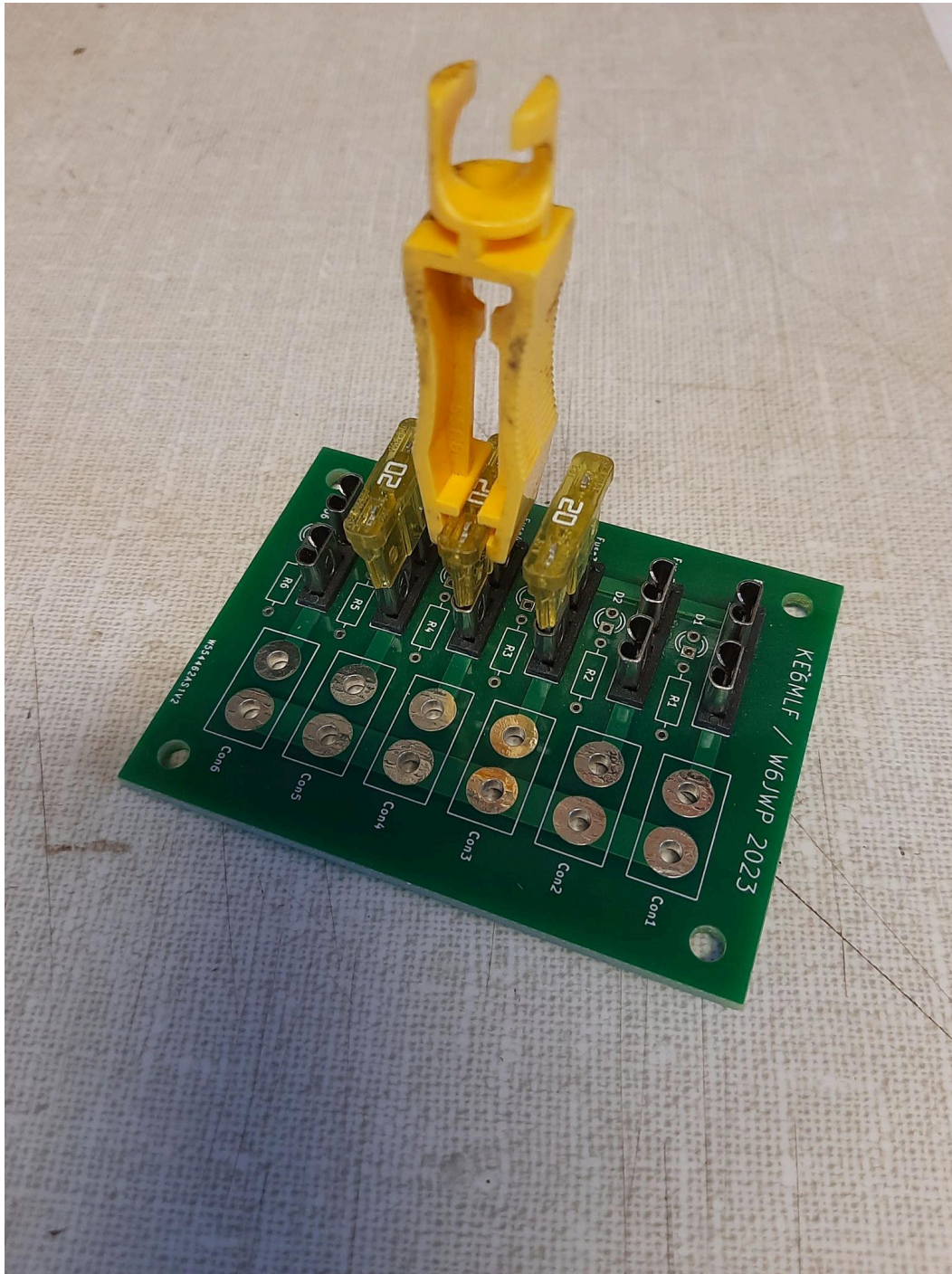
Pulling fuses can be a pain

My fat fingers can not get the fuses out of my own fuse block design. I need to get some more of these pullers off of Amazon to keep in **EVERY** tool box I have. The green one has longer reach, but the yellow one is better for closely packed AGC fuses.

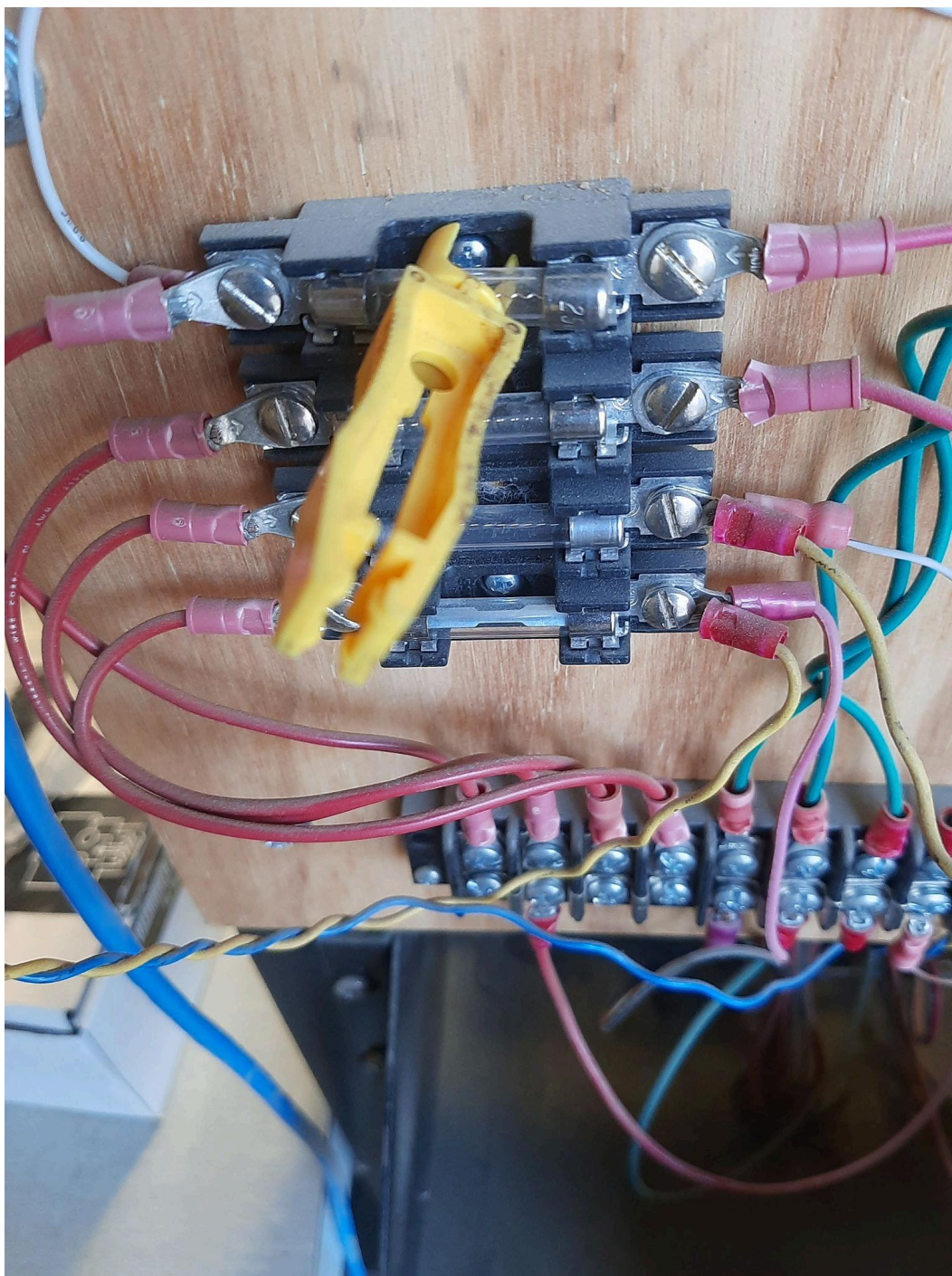


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Both are good, and can pull blade or All Glass (AGC) style fuses.



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Microphone Cable Woes

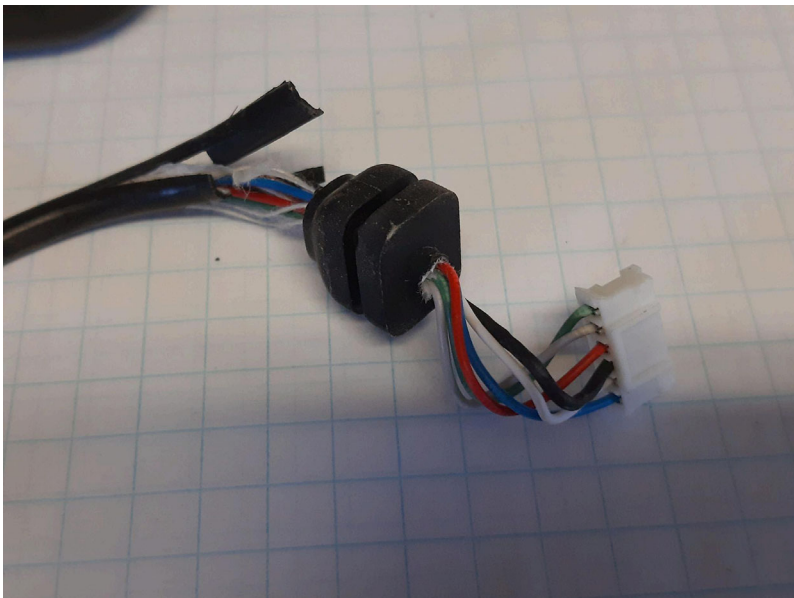
The coily cord for David K06EJH is falling apart. A common issue, always seems to start at the mic end, not the radio connector. No problem.



The microphone with offending cable. Looks like the strain relief disintegrated, the coils and connector parts look good.

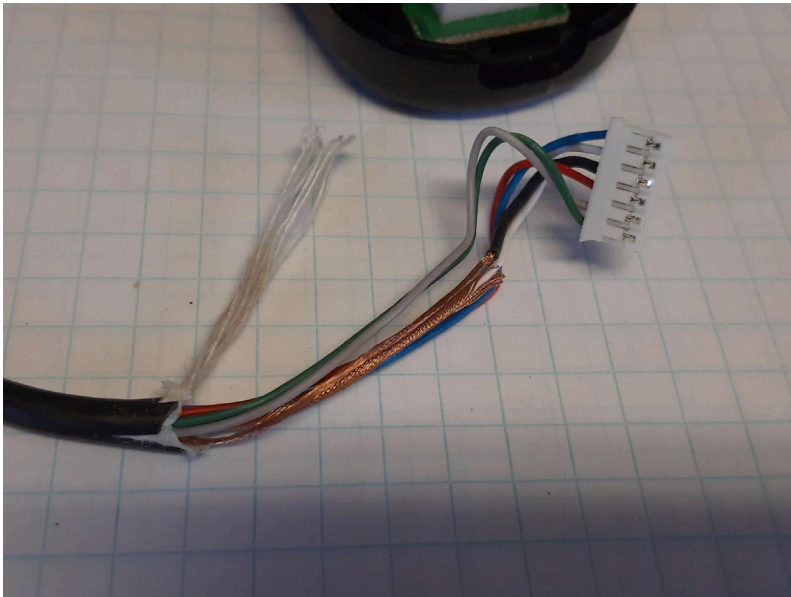


Crack the case open.

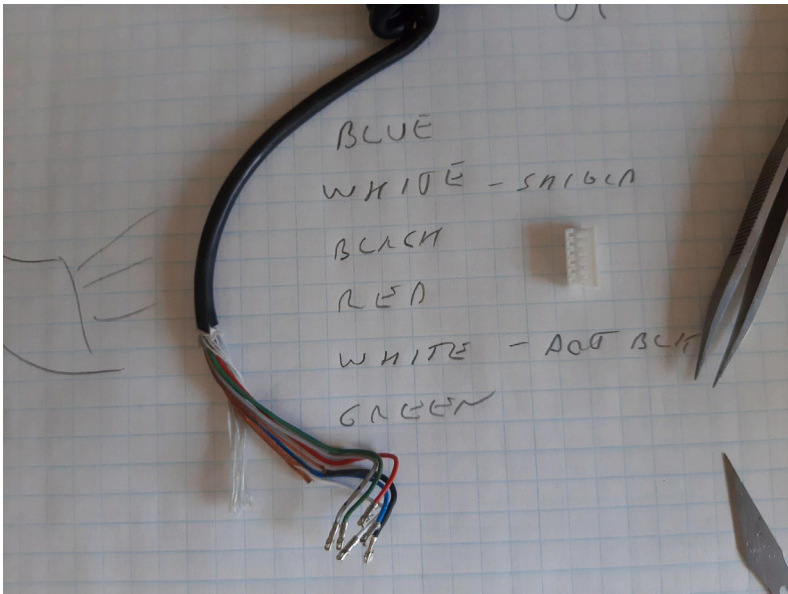


Cut off the strain relief, cut off the degraded part of the outer sleeving.

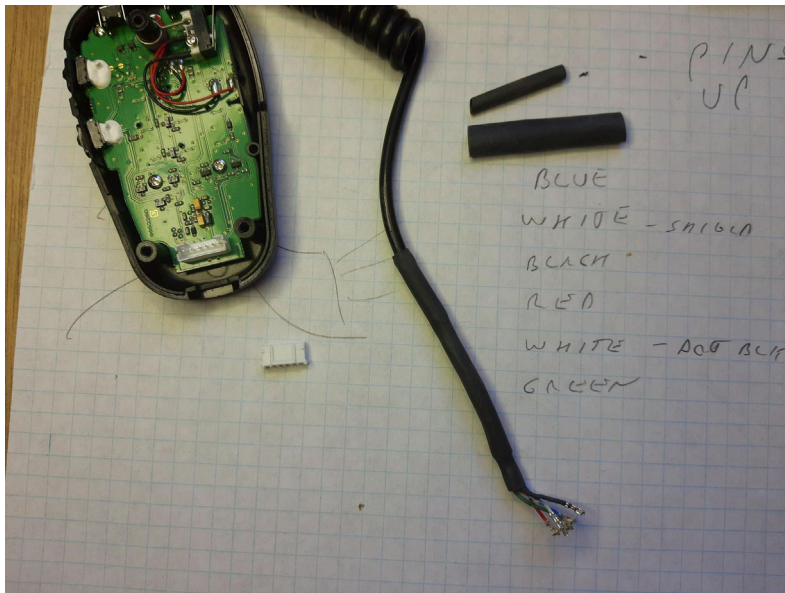
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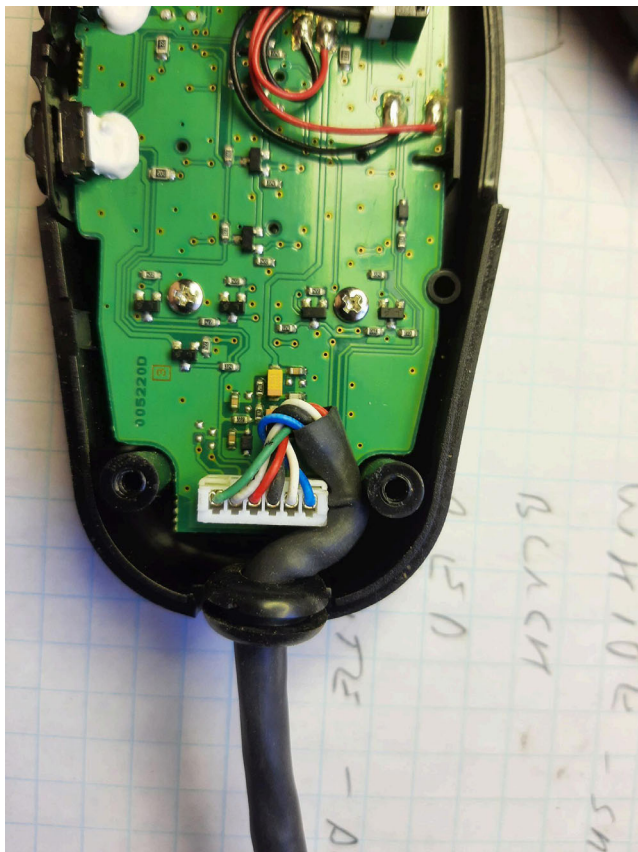
Cable cleaned up. See the tiny shiny silver bits? A pair of tweezers and tiny knife blade let you slide the individual pins out without any damage. The white strings are for strength and fillers to make the cable round.



Vitality important! Make a list of what color goes to what pin position.



New heat shrink tubing, 2 layers.



Found a grommet that fits in the cable entry. Connector back on, and the heat shrink tubing warmed up enough to form around the connector, provides a bit of strain relief.

Screwed the case back together, and delivered it to David for testing.

What are we going to do next time? Go to Amazon and buy a replacement already to go with connectors and strain relief for \$10. Probably a cheap clone, but will work for a few years.

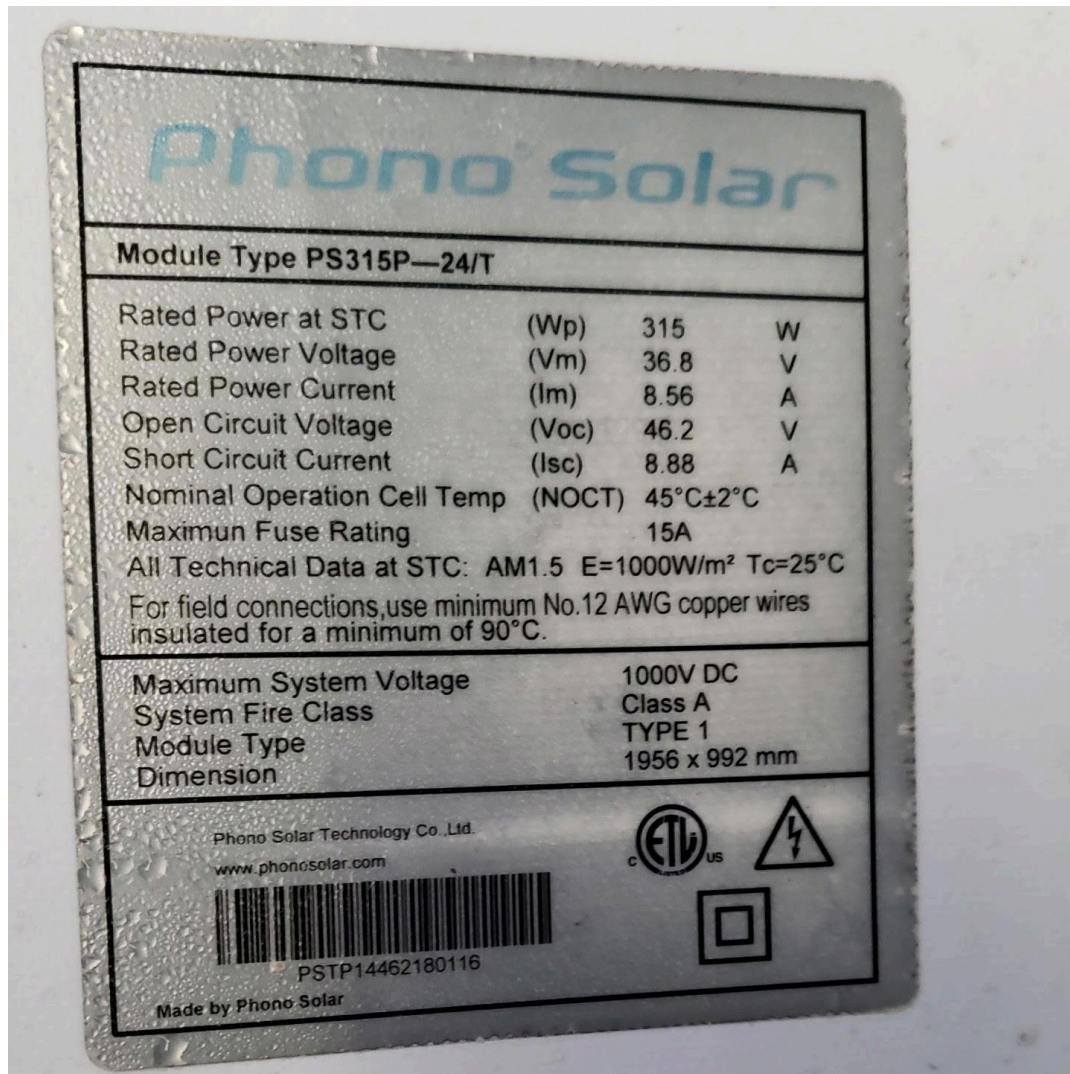
SSARC Marketplace

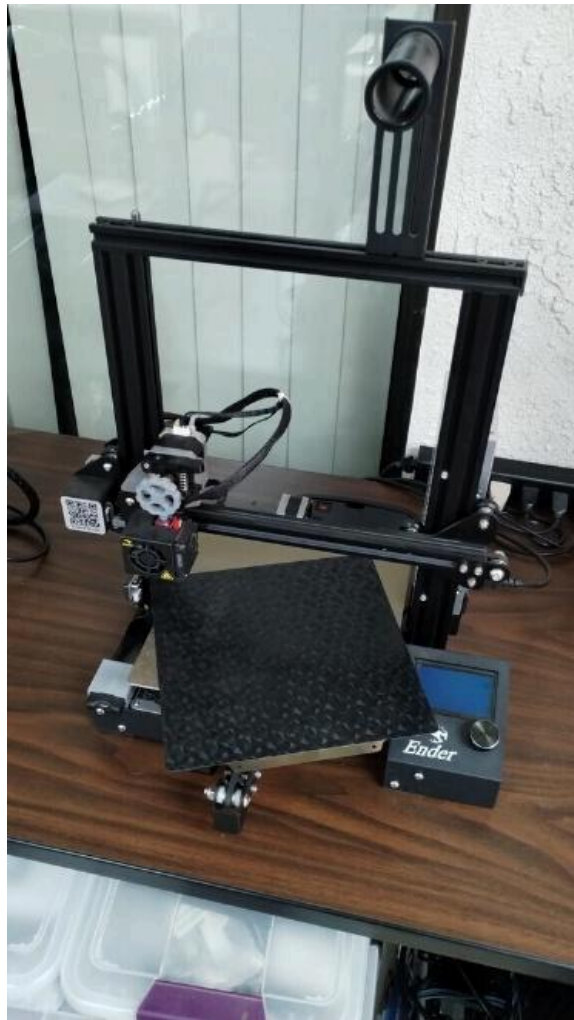

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LAFAYETTE RADIO MODEL TE-50 TUBE TESTER



This portable tube tester from Lafayette Radio is perfect for testing vacuum tubes from classic radios and television receivers sold back in the day. It has eight tube sockets capable of testing standard Octal, Loctal, 7-pin miniature, 9-pin miniature types as well as well as 9- and 12-pin Compactron tubes and nuvistor tubes that were popular back in the 1950's and 1960's. Tests include leakage, shorts and tube emission (e.g.- gain or μ -measurements). The tester includes a slide-out chart drawer plus supplemental charts for newer-type tubes listing the required selector switch and slide switch settings for each tube under test including a test clip for testing tubes with high-voltage anode top caps such as those used for horizontal sweep circuits of earlier televisions. Similar Lafayette Model TE-50 Tube Testers are listed on E-Bay for \$99.99 or more.
